



Shoreline visited The Burton Art Gallery to see some of our pupils work displayed in the schools art exhibition. There was also an amazing LEGO exhibition.












Science at Torlands

Year 10 studied how to make a home-made battery as part of the Global Battery Experiment being run by the Royal Society of Chemistry. We set up cells of 2p coins, cardboard soaked in salt solution and a disc of tin foil. Using a voltmeter we found that this produced about 0.3v on its own. As we increased the number of cells by stacking them on top of each other we could make a battery that produced 2.5v. We think that the cell can store chemical energy and this is really useful for when energy is needed and can be transferred to another store of energy by electricity e.g. to make a motor or light bulb work.

Here are some molecules built by an outreach pupil who was studying covalent bonding in Chemistry. Wow! Great work!

STANSFIELD

AN INSPECTOR CALLS

When learning about and analysing plays, it's incredibly important that pupils can understand the text as a construct intending to be performed. Due to the global pandemic, opportunities for all of us to access live performances have been minimal. Therefore, when the opportunity arose to take Y11 pupils to see a production of An Inspector Calls at the Theatre Royal, staff jumped at the chance.

Over two days in March, supported by the Senior Leadership Team, two groups of Y11 pupils travelled to Plymouth and climbed to the heights of the Upper Circle to watch the crimes of the Birling family unfold. Riveted during the performance, pupils discussed afterwards how seeing the play helped them to translate what they had learned about in their English lessons to a more solid understanding of character and plot. The pupils particularly enjoyed when the house, like the reputation of the family, came crashing down onto the stage before them. Staff were then gifted an education in modern music on the way back from the theatre - the days were a learning experience for all!

It was encouraging to see pupils from Stansfield Academy enriching their experience of education and English Literature alongside hundreds of other pupils around the county. A huge thank you to all the staff members who helped the English team make it happen.

Donkey Management Program

Our second group has just finished their course on Donkey management at the Donkey Sanctuary, Sidmouth. What an amazing charity. Our pupils have been involved in all aspects of caring for a donkey. This involved building empathy, noting signs of agitation and distress, calmness and patience which was complemented by feeding, mucking out, learning dietary needs, basic care skills and attaching and leading the donkeys by harness. Our final session culminated in setting a sensory treat trail for the donkeys who had to discover all sorts of tasty rewards hidden in their paddock. The boys did so well that the educational liaison link has invited the pupils to the follow up course at the next stage- Donkey Facilitated Learning. This involves a lot of hands on interaction and self reflection with their own personally selected donkey! We will let you know how they get on in over the course of the Summer term.

Bike Maintenance

Mountain bike maintenance at Haldon Forest

We have been taking groups up to Haldon Forest and learning basic bike maintenance. The boys have used tyre levers, hex keys to adjust and check the moving parts. The station has a pump with a tyre pressure monitor which also provided a nice cardio work out for the lads. We also went through a cycling safety routine including wearing the appropriate safety gear and general on-site safety management. The pupils have been amazing and used the pump track and the circular track with increasing skill. We are currently having our bikes serviced, in time for the summer term and we will be using the trails and utilising the safe trails the local area has to offer.

Caradon Academy have pupils now on Work Experience. A is now in Placement with All Connections Electrical. A said he loved the experience and was really enjoying getting hands on. He is applying for a college place and we have set up taster days in College for him and all Year 11 pupils too. We have pupils in Beauty Salons, Hairdressers and Electric Firms. It has been great for their confidence, self-esteem and life experiences, not to mention how great it shall be on their CV & College Applications. Last year Caradon Academy had completely successful outcomes as all Year 11 ended up in a positive outcomes and were enjoying college placements. It is great for pupils to learn, achieve and increase their social skills in the real world of work.



Secondary nurture careers visits to Woodland Valley Farm & Cornwall Beaver Sanctuary

During this half term Caradon's secondary nurture group have made four trips to Woodland Valley Farm and Beaver Sanctuary looking at careers in husbandry and farming whilst also learning about sustainable farming practices.

Pupils had hands on experiences of looking after pigs, cows... and of course beavers!

It was great to see how well they engaged with the staff at the farm and their attitude during tasks such as helping build dams for the beavers!



A place to myself,










Science practical sessions have continued at Truro College, with pupils having a hands on experience of setting up and collecting results for some of the required practicals needed for the GCSE exams.
